



Missouri AmeriCorps Members serve up to 1,700 hours in a year to help their community. They may receive a living stipend and



earn an education award at the end of their service to pay for school or student loans.

Bicentennial Service Challenge

In celebration of Missouri's 200th birthday, the Bicentennial Commission and MCSC challenged Missourians to volunteer 200 hours in



their community. They answered the call volunteering over 120,000 hours!

MCSC sponsored projects:

- 1,384 volunteers recruited
- 300 meals served
- 679 cards written to seniors
- 8,000 pounds of food distributed
- 7,377 people served

9/11 Day of Service and Remembrance

In partnership with the 9/11 Day Foundation and St. Louis Area Foodbank, MCSC supported over 800 volunteers who packed over 200,000 meals that were distributed to sites throughout the St. Louis area.




COVID-19 RESPONSE

From the beginning of the pandemic, our Members and volunteers never stopped serving! They continued to work with kids while schools were virtual. They ensured families had the food and supplies they needed while staying at home. They worked with local and state agencies to provide **COVID** testing and vaccinations.

In total, our programs helped thousands get tested and 173,879 Missourians get vaccinated!

ShowMeService.org hosts Missouri's Show Me Service Awards, the Volunteer of the Week, information on our AmeriCorps programs, and a statewide volunteer opportunity search.

Visitors can search through hundreds of volunteer opportunities in communities throughout the state.

Through our partnership with Missouri Broadcasters Association, nearly a half million dollars worth of TV, radio, and digital advertisements called on Missourians to serve in their community.


